Three meetings...

- Pre-meeting introduction and identify areas
- Second meeting the "on-foot" survey on routes in the area
- Concluding meeting accountability





The aim is

- a mutual exchange of ideas and viewpoints
- an opportunity to disseminate information
- discuss constructive ideas for changes.





Things to consider in the process

- Surveys with different purposes
- Readiness to act
- Participants
- Statistics
- Discussion leader





Longterm commitment

- The process needs to be established
- Not just a one time happening





A way to collect data to the local needs analysis

- Both municipalities and local police districts use neighbourhood security survey to collect data, often in a joint venture.
- A common participant group is children and young people Both in schools and in other public places
